HOUSING NEEDS

HOUSING IS LINKED TO HEALTHY AGEING BECAUSE IT PROMOTES THE POSSIBILITY OF REMAINING INDEPENDENT. ADJUSTMENTS MAY BE NECESSARY TO HELP PEOPLE ADAPT IN ORDER TO MAINTAIN A SENSE OF WELLBEING AND INDEPENDENCE IN DAILY LIFE.

- Housing modifications become more important as people age due to changes in our needs and health which can have an impact on what constitutes a safe and independent home
- There is a need to plan for how to manage maintenance - for our homes and ourselves

KEY INFORMATION

- Recent aarp research shows that 75% of Americans want to stay in their homes and 77% hope to remain in their neighborhoods (numbers are similar in Canada)
- According to Canadian research 100 % of seniors surveyed want to stay in their homes as they age (National Institute of Aging 2022)
- Older adults are more vulnerable to environmental hazards reinforcing the link between housing and health

COMMON ISSUES FOR AGING AT HOME

- cost of staying in your home
- cost of outdoor maintenance, house repairs, and indoor maintenance
- yearly cost for cutting grass, maintaining a garden, and snow removal
- replacement of roof, windows, air conditioner, hot water tank
- yearly cost for house cleaning, heating and cooling, home and/or car insurance
- cost for small renovations: handrails, shower rails, ramp
- cost for large renovations: accessible doorways, bathroom, shower, counter height changes, main level living



THOUGHTS TO CONSIDER

If you are contemplating retiring, it may be helpful to complete a retirement budget worksheet to see the differences in costs before you retire and after you stop working.

HOUSING SOLUTION LAB EXPLORING PURPOSED-BASED SENIOR/NEWCOMER HOUSING IN NORTHUMBERLAND AND PETERBOROUGH

PROBLEM STATEMENT

How can a hub model, through the integration of social enterprise and housing, address the growing need for affordable and appropriate housing that supports a purpose-filled life and builds community for older adults within Northumberland County and Peterborough?

- Local study completed in partnership with Metropolitan University and local senior/housing organizations (2015)
- This Solution Lab used interviews and workshops to identify challenges, needs and programming/service gaps, working toward developing a potential solution specific to the primary population which addresses the unique constraints of this rural geographic area.

Many provinces in Canada have already begun making innovative changes towards aging at home.



HOUSING FOR SENIORS:

Partnering with CMHC and Solution Lab, the objective of this project was developing a model of purpose-driven, affordable housing in rural and small-medium sized urban areas.

- proximity to friends and family

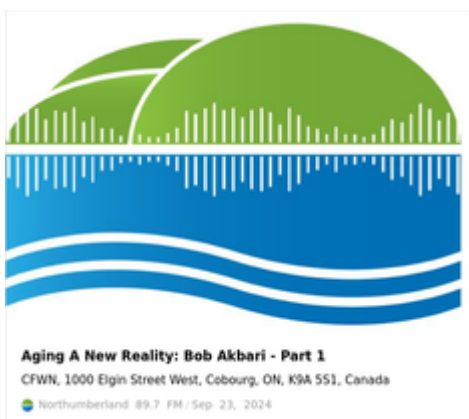
